

- Scheduled visit to The Central Kitchen in Cleveland (incubator & food hub)
- Created AmeriCorps VISTA shared position for SH & Solidarity Farms


1. Economic Development, Urban Farm & Retail Expansion | **Involvement Opportunities**

- Examine feasibility of USDA Urban Agriculture Planning Grant for 2022 and possibility of partnership with government & urban farms
- Establish network of urban farms
- Engage with local experts on marketing for urban farms
- Create infrastructure for urban farms looking to expand farm to institution and/or consumer efforts
- Establish first grocer “Double Up Produce Perks” program at Fligners and engage other local grocers
- Engage new grocery store locations to accept EBT/SNAP and WIC
- Recruit AmeriCorps VISTA for shared Second Harvest & Solidarity Farms to focus on health & hunger

2. Healthcare Partnerships, Diabetes Prevention, and Nutrition/Culinary Literacy

Strategy 2	Establish robust healthcare partnerships with a focus on diabetes prevention and nutrition education/culinary literacy programming.
Intents	Increase healthcare sector awareness of community-based food-focused resources to support patients with healthy eating behavior change



- Work to establish produce Rx at Free Clinic


2. Healthcare Partnerships, Diabetes Prevention, and Nutrition/Culinary Literacy | **Involvement Opportunities**
